### THIS MONTH IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR

The Battles of Lexington and Concord were the first major military campaign of the American Revolutionary War, resulting in an American victory and outpouring of militia support for the anti-British cause. [9] The battles were fought on April 19, 1775, in Middlesex County in the colonial era Province of Massachusetts Bay, within the towns of Lexington, Concord, Lincoln, Menotomy (present-day Arlington), and Cambridge. They marked the outbreak of armed conflict between the Kingdom of Great Britain and Patriot militias from America's Thirteen Colonies.

# Minutes April 14th 2025 Zoom Meeting

Meeting opened at 6:32 PM by President Jim Jackson.

Mr. Julien Icher, President of the Lafayette Trail, Inc. will be present, as well as members of the Carondelet Historical Society and the government of St. Louis. The National Association SAR will be represented by Secretary General Michael Elston. Our date is two days before the date Lafayette visited the area 200 years ago.
